## Harvest Festival

The Harvest Festival held on two bright and sunny days October 16th and 17th, and was VERY well attended by the public. The City Service, Park Maintenance, and Recreation Departments provided much help to get the outside flower beds and tent area ready for the festival. The Parks and City removed all the shrubs and plants around both the Starr and Darrow houses. A wire mesh was installed at the Starr house to deter the ground hogs. Mums and pumpkins were placed in the beds to provide color for the festival. The gardens will be replanted with new shrubs to give us a new look! We had 16 vendors who participated in the festival with such things as jewelry, handbags, wooden flutes, stained glass window panels, wooden toys and scented candles, The Alpacas and their wool products were in the tent, along with cement bird baths, jewelry, and pumpkin painting.

The day began on Saturday, even before the 11am festival time, with Houston Morgan's family starting the apple butter cooking. This year we made 149 pints, with the same process that has been used since 1978. Throughout the day many people who attended the festival helped with the apple butter stirring.

The Heritage Barn Kitchen volunteers included Cathy Flower, LaVerne Corathers, Kay Garner, Karen DePalo, Karen Smith, and Liz Lattimer.

A special table was staffed by Fred Long and Beth Daugherty. They sold and signed the new book "Images of America—Stow and Munroe Falls" which they selected the pictures, wrote the text and edited. If you missed getting your copy, please come to our meeting or call us.



The Starr, Darrow, and Museum houses were open and manned with able volunteers asked by Jean and Charlie Call at the Starr House, by Willa and Ed Williams at the Darrow House, and by Karen DePalo at the Museum. Entertainment was supplied by Dave Henterly on Sunday afternoon using spoons, washboard, and many other musical items.

The festival concluded with the annual drawing for a refinished caned chair donated by the Cuyahoga Falls Caning Group.
