The Starr House has received a new roof. The 50 year shingles used are the same color as those used on the Minnie Darrow roof. Lanning Construction submitted a winning bid for the job. New foundation pads for both sets of steps have been poured, and the stone steps will be reset on the new foundations. Internal wall repairs and repainting should be completed before the festival. The front door and frame are rotted out and must be replaced. The kitchen door has the same problem and should be replaced.
