### A Note from the President

As we move through the summer, we have several things going on for the Historical Society. As all of you know, Phase One of the Old School House (OSH) Project has been completed with the move of the house to its site at the Heritage Reserve Park in Silver Springs Park. Phase Two has begun with the leadership of Bob Flower's construction team to side and roof the structure. In addition, they will be starting the interior of the building with the electrical work and drywall. At the same time the Fundraising Committee of Annie Hanson, Linda Trevorrow, John Pribonic, and Steve Hailer have begun Phase Two of the fundraising campaign to raise an addition \$55,000. This phase of the fundraising will be to finish up the inside and complete the outside of the building so that we can begin to use it for various activities.

Upcoming events that we have planned are the Annual Picnic which again this year will be at the Heritage Barn on Monday, August 25<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm. This is a covered dish dinner with the entrée and drinks provided. Our annual Harvest Festival will be the first weekend in October (4 and 5). We will be in need of volunteers for the event to help out in the houses while people are walking through them, and passing out food in the Heritage Barn. Any amount of time is helpful for any of our events.

#### **Spring Programs & Events**

Stow Historical Society was pleased to offer three unique and interesting programs at our spring member meetings. John R. Walker of Stow discussed his book *Bracketing the Enemy: Forward Observers in World War II* at our March 24th meeting. The book details the history of artillery forward observation usage, which began with the Civil War. On April 28th Mary McClure told the story of Silver Lake Park, the "Coney Island of the West" with a slide show of images of the park which was in existence for approximately forty years. Our third meeting of the year was held June 23rd with speaker Linda Alexander. Linda's ancestor was Clara Driscoll, designer of Tiffany lamps and independent woman of the early 20th century.

Attendees enjoyed our display, along with the presence of Ohio Living History members costumed in Civil War era clothing. OLH members donated their time to support our organization. ### **Old Schoolhouse Update**

Phase Two Status of the OSH Project - The restoration of the outside of the building has begun! Replacement replicas of the doors and windows have been installed. The siding is about 60% completed. Efforts are underway to get the roof replacement started, using a standing seam metal roof. Electricity is needed to continue the restoration work, and we are getting estimates

for that. The Interior Restoration Team had their first meeting last week, and will have another soon. If you have interest in the task of restoring the interior, please call and attend that meeting. The Fund Raising Team is formulating plans to raise an additional \$55,000— if you have not made your contribution to support our OSH, NOW is a good time.
