Upcoming Programs

Please plan to attend the exciting programs lined up for our spring member meetings. On **March 25th** speaker Barb Baltrinic of Munroe Falls will discuss her ancestor, Abraham Clark of New Jersey, who was a signer of the Declaration of Independence. A former English teacher, Baltrinic spent more than six

years researching her ancestor. Her book, A Founder for All: Abraham Clark, Signer of the Declaration of Independence was published in December. It was written in order to share information about a seldom-referenced Founding Father and also to create a lasting legacy for her family.

The **April 22nd** meeting features Ruth Ann Hulthen and Olivia Walton with a presentation on the mountain dulcimer. Ruth has been playing the mountain dulcimer for over ten years. She and Olvia are co-authors of a dulcimer book and CD—"Bountiful Folk – Duets and Such", as well as co-leaders of the Black Squirrel dulcimer group. Ruth also belongs to Tri-County Dulcimer, and Mixed-up Strings. Olivia has been playing guitar since the 1960's and dulcimer since 2007, and is a member of three other dulcimer clubs. Both women also teach the instrument and are producing a new CD, *Bountiful Folk—Outstanding in our Field*.



Our June meeting will be a field trip! We will meet **Saturday**, **June 22nd at 10:00 a.m.** at the Mustill Store, 248 Ferndale Street, Akron, 44304 for a tour and short walk with Denny Reiser. The Mustill Store and House is a visitor center and museum on the Towpath Trail. It is the last combination residence and commercial structure of its kind along the Ohio & Erie Canal. The exhibits inside tell about Akron's rise from a frontier to an industrial power. A short business meeting will be held after the tour.

Old Schoolhouse Update

It is time we brought everyone up to date regarding the Old Schoolhouse Project. The Fund Raising Committee has been very active and has made our project well known to all in the area via the Harvest Festival kickoff and the *Stow Sentry* Mini-series. They also have visited Stow businesses and organizations and placed donation canisters in their stores. The organizations have responded with donations including the Stow Munroe Falls Rotary with a donation of \$10,000. The FRC also submitted a grant request to the Lehner Family Foundation of Munroe Falls. They also responded with a grant of \$10,000. With these donations and the money in the bank, we have almost enough to build the new building foundation and move the building.

The Construction Team has been active in doing the necessary things to make the building move happen. This included submitting the request to move the building to the City of Stow Planning and Zoning committee. This was approved by them, approved by the Council Planning committee, and City Council. We were then OK to hire a registered architect to draw up the foundation details, and other documents required by the Stow Building department. The architect has been hired and the drawings are being prepared. We next have to get the plans approved by the City. We also met with the Metro Parks to have them initiate the transfer of the building to the City of Stow. We have their cooperation and support for the move, and they do not have plans for that property in 2013. The new site for the OSH has been selected and stakes are in the ground. You can drive into Heritage Reserve Park, go past the copula and the site is on the left.

There are opportunities to apply your time and talents to the tasks related to the move preparation and the post move restoration. If you or someone you know would like to volunteer as part of the OSH Committee, please call Bob Flower or John Baranek. We are working towards a goal of moving in the third quarter of this year.
